INTRODUCTION

The land at Georgetown is situated adjacent to Craig's House and on the periphery of the Georgetown area of Dumfries. The land is specifically excluded from the local development plan, but given its location, it is a fair assumption that there may be opportunities in the long-term for some development. At present the land is utilised for agricultural and equestrian purposes and lends itself to a variety of lifestyle uses, given its proximity to the residential development.

All services are located within the busy market town of Dumfries, boasting all essential and professional services, along with three retail parks, an ice rink, and a University Campus. Dumfries offers a wide choice of both primary and secondary schooling with the Crichton University Campus offering a wide variety of further education choices.

This area of Southwest Scotland enjoys one of the most varied and picturesque landscapes within Scotland, ranging from the moorland of the Southern Upland Hills to the bays and sandy beaches of the distinctive coastline. This is a rural county where agriculture and tourism thrive to form the backbone of the local economy. The area has been relatively unscathed by modern industry.



The land lies within a ring fence and is bounded on two sides by minor public roads. At present the land is all down to grass for grazing and or conservation and is currently utilised for agricultural and equestrian purposes.
